Midnight - January 1st 1994 - the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) went into effect, intergrating the economies of the United States, Canada and Mexico. To mark the occasion units of the Zapatista National Liberation Army stormed four towns in the state of Chapas, southern Mexico to fight the ascendancy of neoliberalism in the region. In December 1994 the United States invites

leaders from across the Americas, proposing an extension to NAFTA - The Free Trade Area of the Americas (FTAA) would create the largest 'trade' zone on the planet, with all it's harmful effects on local communities and public institutions.

This film documents the fight back against the FTAA before it can be imposed - from Quebec City to Ecuador. **IMC 60 mins 2002**
