Why are we here today?

We are here in solidarity with 32 stall-holders. They are refusing to sign new contracts that will increase rents by up to 100% and will be back dated. Most reckon they'll go out of business as a result of this. We believe there should be a vibrant market in Leeds where we can buy cheap, local goods. We are against the Council's plans to change the market and the way they make decisions without asking the people of Leeds.

The Council wants to help its friends in big business. It wants happy shoppers content to empty their pockets in overpriced boutiques and expensive café bars, and is not interested in keeping Leeds city centre accessible to all.
