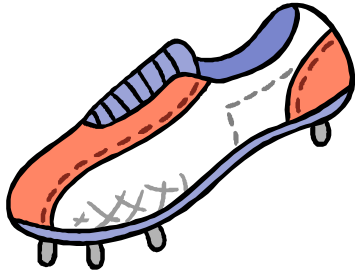


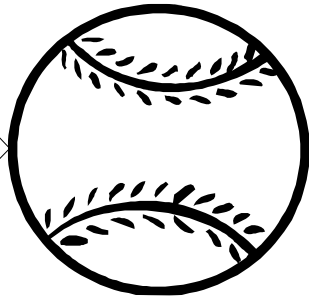
# Who made your toys, clothes, hair-clips, shoes, football..?
