Romper el Cerco (Breaking the Siege)

San Salvador Atenco, May 2006. A small town in the suburbs of Mexico City. Two months before the presidential elections, a conflict for land and rights escalates between the local population and the Mexican government. The police attack a marketplace, the inhabitants block the highways leading to the city, and confrontations break out between an outraged population and the state, leading to widespread human rights abuses. This documentary shows the story that wasn't told by the mass media, determined to ignore the concerns of the population and generate a climate of fear in order to justify the brutality. (*Approx 50 mins*)

El Gas no se Vende (The Gas is not for Sale)

In October 2003, the Bolivian government's plans to privatise the nation's gas industry were met with mass resistance. Over 80 people killed and hundreds wounded as the army, supplied by the US, was brought out against them. (*Approx 15 mins*)
