The BNP — the truth

■ The BNP has terrorist connections

David Copeland — the former BNP member — who carried out the London nail bombings in Brixton, Brick Lane and Soho said: "My aim was political. It was to cause a racial war... then all white people would go and vote BNP."

■ The BNP is a fascist organisation

The BNP follows in the footsteps of Hitler's Nazis. When fascists come to power they mass murder large sections of communities and shut down democracy and freedom.

■ The BNP denies the holocaust

6 million Jews were murdered in the Nazi Holocaust. In total 15 million Jews, trade unionists, gypsies, Slavs, Black, lesbian, gay and disabled people were murdered as a result of Nazi Germany's murderous policies. BNP leader Nick Griffin was convicted for inciting racial hatred after a magazine he published denied this.

■ The BNP and racist violence

Racist attacks increase in areas the BNP targets. In Barking and Dagenham — where the BNP has 12 councillors — according to figures from the local Race Equality Council racist attacks increased by 30% between 2002 and 2004. This corresponds with increased BNP activity in the area.

The fascist BNP — a threat to democracy and freedom

■he British National Party (BNP) will be targeting this year's elections to promote their politics of hate.

The BNP — violence and criminality

The BNP claims to be a normal political party. It is not. The BNP's record since May 2006 shows it is a violent organisation full of criminal thugs:

- David Enderby, the BNP councillor in Redditch, West Midlands, was found guilty of three counts of assault in January 2007.
- His agent in the elections Kevin Hughes was sentenced to three months in prison for racially aggravated common assault in May 2006.
- The Parliamentary candidate for Hull in the May 2005 general election, Brian Wainwright, pleaded guilty to a campaign of hate mail against a mosque, a Muslim councillor and an anti-fascist activist. A letter in which he claimed, "Muslim blood will be spilt" included 'SS' skull and crossbones imagery. Another letter was sent to a local anti-fascist activist threatening that Combat 18 (the Nazi terrorist organisation who take their name from Hitler's initials) would visit.
- BNP activist in Swindon Mark Bulman was sentenced to five years in January 2007 after attempting to firebomb a local mosque using a BNP leaflet as a fuse. He also daubed swastikas and racist graffiti on local shops and businesses that he believed to be 'ethnic'.

■ In June 2006 **Burnley BNP** councillor Brian Turner was found guilty of a racially aggravated public order offence.Turner has previous convictions of common assault and police assault after he was convicted of beating up his wife.



The BNP is against mixed-race relationships


These are not the actions of councillors and activists from a legitimate political party.

The BNP is a fascist organisation

When fascists came to power in Nazi Germany they mass murdered large sections of communities and shut down democracy and freedom. The BNP attempts to prettify its image. However it is a fascist organisation:

- The BNP was founded following a spilt from the openly Nazi organisation the National Front.
- A Channel 5 documentary showed how the BNP receives money from the sale of neo-Nazi music and fundraiser events.

■ Mark Collett, a leading BNP member, was caught on Channel 4's Dispatches documentary in 2002 praising Hitler and claiming that Nazi Germany was a better place to live than some parts of Britain.
