## Who are we?

WELCOME to the Southgate Phoenix, a community newsletter produced by the Community Anchor & local arts group, Green Pea.

We think it's important for people of different backgrounds to unite on the basis of their shared geography. Shouldn't the people who live and work in an area be informed about the plans and policies that directly affect them?

The Anchor project exists to address this by bringing people who do not normally mix together, to improve co-ordination between groups and increase local participation in decision—making. We hope it will provide a forum allowing Southgate residents to 'work and dream together'.

Our first Anchor Meetings, held in May, were a great success: local concerns were identified and positive, practical ideas discussed. Concerns which were raised at the meetings included safety on our streets, lack of cleanliness, loss of community, red-tape, high commercial rents and the ASDA(Walmart) effect.

Some ideas put forward included: community noticeboards, a community radio station, local health service (LHS) and an after school youth club.

#### **Local Public Service Provision**

There was agreement that big business and central government are not always the answer to our problems, and we would ask them to support local communities, helping them to be good stewards, rather than setting up procedural barriers.

As a first step we want to set up a community-owned street market and get Enfield Council to allow seating outside all the cafes and restaurants in Ashfield Parade. Our ultimate aim is for the parade to be turned into a 'Town Square' on at least one day a week, with a continental piazza feeling to enjoy.

TRANSITION years youth project

Working with David Burrowes MP and Enfield Youth Services Green Pea Arts have been developing an inexpensive, community-run After School Club for 8-13 yrs, to start in September 2008 at the Alan Pullinger centre. We are now inviting parents, students and teachers of all schools in N14 to register before the Summer break.

We aim to run the club 2-3 afternoons a week, helping students 8-13 years (ie, in transition between primary and secondary school) by offering art and citizenship based activities including homework support.
