## not amnesty for a few

We have come together to demonstrate today because we believe that the demand for regularization is necessary to improve the lives and working conditions of all migrant people.

But why, as has been proposed, should this apply only to some?

Why divide communities and families into legal and illegal, good and bad immigrants?

Everyone has the right to live and work in this country. This right should not be dependent on:

- \* the language we speak (how could we study English after a 16 hour working day?)
- \*the amount of time we have already spent in the country (and what should we do in the meantime?)
- \*our readiness to providing information to the state (and what if we are refused?)
- \* a work-contract that binds us to an employer (and what if we want to protest and mobilise our workplaces or change our job?)

In the current moment of **recession**, the illegalization of migrants workers is used as an excuse to sack them when they are no longer needed and get rid of them when they organize for fair conditions.

We are made illegal by a hypocritical system that at once asks us to be "good" migrants, while hiding our everyday reality: anti-social working hours, social exclusion, police oppression and discrimination in the labour market. Stricter immigration controls, the expansion of detention centres and deportation, and the new regime of checks and raids in the workplace: this is the life of migrants in the UK.
