JIMMY MUBENGA MURDERED BY THE UK BORDER REGIME



Jimmy Mubenga died on the 12th October 2010, while being deported to Angola was being heavily restrained by security guards and had complained of breathing problems before he collapsed, a witness said.

Kevin Wallis, a passenger on the aircraft, said he heard Mubenga complain: "I can't breathe, I can't breathe" for at least 10 minutes before he lost consciousness, and later observed that handcuffs had been used in the restraint.

The guards worked for G4S, a private security firm sub-contracted to carry out deportations.

According to the Institute for Race Relations, 77 people have died as the result of UK's harsh Border Regime in the last 5 years. The Blame for Jimmy's Death must be shared by the officials, politicians and media commentators who support this increasingly racist system of oppression.
