From the Sarkozy government to the leftist citizens practising pacification, they're doing the old divisions between good demonstrators and ugly rioters.

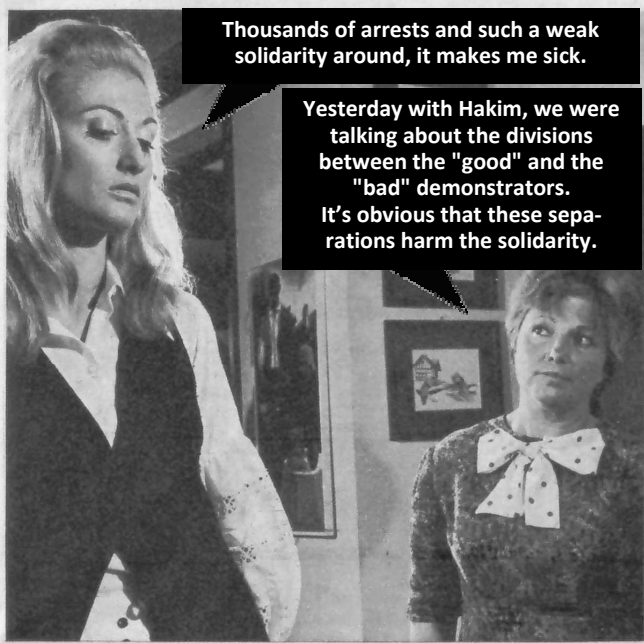
Yet it's only solidarity and actions' diversity that would make the movement becoming more powerful.

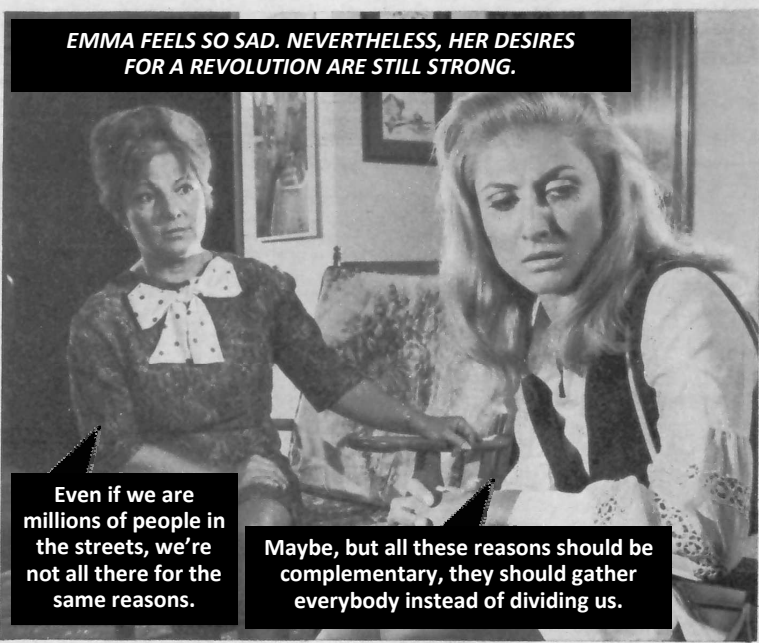
These bloody democrats just want to wait for 2012...

Maybe, but all these reasons should be complementary, they should gather everybody instead of dividing us.



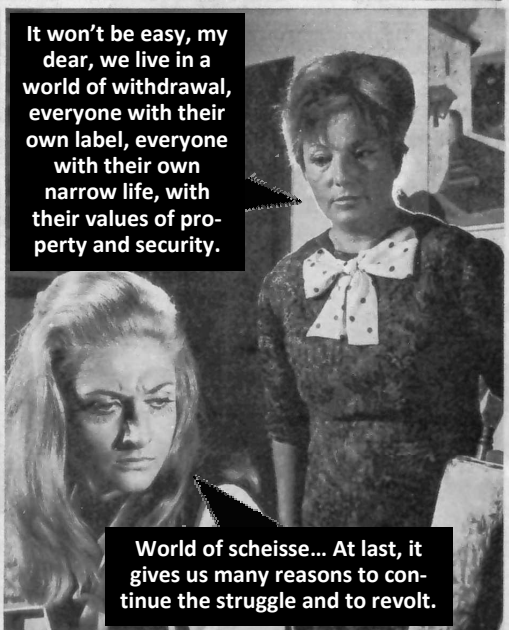
In any case, the power and its police use these divisions and benefit from them.

They don't oppose each other. Now, we need to create connections between everybody.

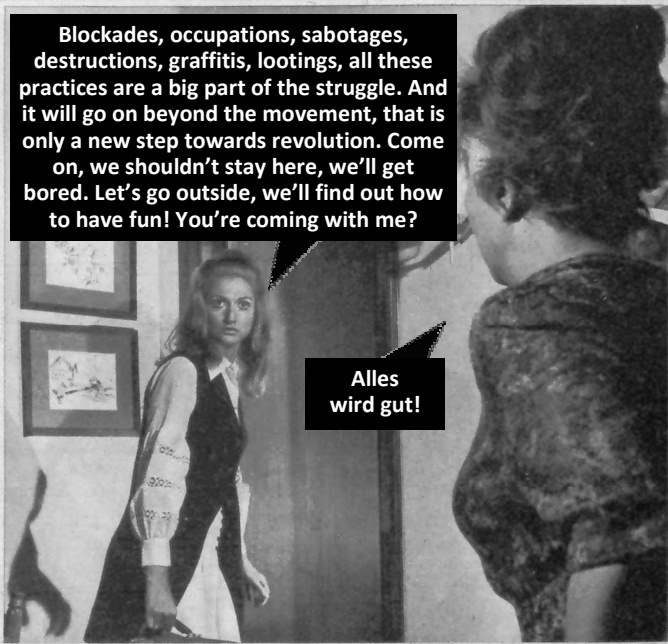


It won't be easy, my dear, we live in a world of withdrawal, everyone with their own label, everyone with their own narrow life, with their values of property and security.
