Guidance

Lockheed Martin are the world's second-largest weapons manufacturer; they make 'Trident' nuclear missiles, and own a one third share of Britain's Aldermaston atomic weapons facility. Currently, the greatest area of growth for Lockheed Martin is in 'Intelligence and Surveillance', and as part of this work the company have been moving into data collection.

“Lockheed Martin UK will be acting as the prime contractor and will be developing the systems to be used to handle and process the Census data” - UK Cabinet Office Report
